

AUTO SAFETY AND SURVIVAL KIT

When going on an extended trip, the following components are necessary to ensure safety and security:

- Accident reporting forms
- Communication devices for use between vehicles (cellular/mobile telephone or two-way radio)
- Blankets
- Bottled water
- Coins for telephone use
- Duct tape
- Emergency phone numbers (road-service, church, pastor, etc.)
- Fire extinguisher (dry chemical)
- First-aid kit
- Flashlight and batteries
- Food (nutrition bars, trail mix, etc.)
- Gloves
- Insurance information
- Jumper cables
- Maps
- Paper towels and toilet tissue
- Radio with fresh batteries
- Rags and towels
